

One preliminary step we have taken is to identify the current status, as well as possible source populations and reintroduction sites





# An example of (cost)effective wetland Restoration using Beaver

- Beaver activity started in Toms Creek reactivating a historic channel – flooding a road. 2012
- Decision was made to harden the road crossing and let the beavers do there thing. 2014
- In 2015 over 3 miles downstream in the historic channel a beaver complex was discovered that has restored a half mile of wetland and riparian habitat.
- There is over another ½ mile of wetland habitat that will likely be restored in the coming years.
